

**THE BODY OF CHRIST**

The distribution of communion has seldom changed. In the earliest Christian centuries, the faithful simply took the bread and cup in hand as at any meal. The Church in the Middle Ages reserved the communion cup for the clergy. The laity, if they received communion at all, were limited to the reception of the host on the tongue. Now, for the first time in history, the church formally offers the option of taking communion on the tongue or in the hand.

No matter which method we choose, reverence for the Eucharist should guide us. Those who choose communion in the mouth experience the gift of God unmediated by the touch of their own hand. Those who choose communion in the hand see God's gift in hands which serve others. Either way, we come to the table like beggars with open mouths and open hands – not taking the food ourselves but begging it from another human being.

Too often we rush this intimate moment. Sometimes we resemble fast food more than banquet.

Think of taking communion in five distinct parts: positioning, looking, proclaiming, responding and taking.

First the worshiper gets into position. If you're distributing communion wait for the next person to stop walking. If you're receiving, take a moment to prepare.

Next, look at the bread or the cup. And look at each other. The two of you are the mystery you are about to proclaim.

Then the minister proclaims the mystery: The Body of Christ! The Blood of Christ! (Say it with an exclamation point!) Christ who existed before existence. Christ whose flesh and blood were nailed to a cross. Christ whose body rose from the dead in a new form. Christ who left his body and blood in the Eucharist. Christ whose body we are – this is the Christ we proclaim.

Amen! Respond with faith, joy and hope. Imagine you're saying "Thank you" ("Eucharist!") for the gift you've always wanted, saying "I love you" to the one you love the most, saying "I believe" to a world confused by sin.

Then, only then, take communion. Join in communion with the body of Christ, risen and present all around you.

The Body of Christ. Amen.

## JUSTICE AND CHARITY MINISTRY

**FOOD MINISTRY-INVITATION:** For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles. Currently, we are looking for help with potential **home deliveries** of food to parishioners who can no longer make it to Incarnation. If you are interested in this or any other aspect of the ministry, contact Sheila in the Parish Office. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with paper bags). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. This week, the item of the week is **gallon sized zip-lock bags**.

**OUTREACH MINISTRY UPDATE:** We are blessed in our parish to have generous donors for our many needs. Thank you to all who have donated egg cartons, we now have an abundant supply and are no longer accepting donations. **ALSO**, we don't have the facility to accept donated clothing, please bring your donations to other thrift stores (Hinton Avenue Methodist Church has a free clothing closet, and Salvation Army provides clothing vouchers).

**GREEN TEAM EnvironMINUTE** One way to reduce waste at restaurants is to bring your own take-out dish. Styrofoam takes centuries to break down in landfills, so bringing a reusable container from home can have a big impact over time.

**JUSTICE CORNER:** Sometimes, Justice is a long and uphill battle. It took three years of hard work to get commitments to support young people who needed training to enter the health care field. Because we didn't give up, UVA got a grant to fund the program, and now 80 people per year are getting subsidized training to improve their future career.

**HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD DAYS:** Incarnation participates in the work of Habitat for Humanity, building houses for and with community members in need! No construction experience is necessary, and this is a great way to spend a Saturday living our faith and doing tangible work in the community. We also need people to photograph the event, and provide lunch. Our next build dates are July 15, September 16, and November 4. Please check out the sign-up sheets in the Narthex!



**CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING (CST) 101:** In the world today, it sometimes feels like the economy is the ultimate good that must be served. Our Catholic Social Teaching tells a different story, saying that the economy exists for the good of the people, not the other way around. Work becomes not just a way of making ends meet, but a way of participating in God's creative being. Thus, there is dignity in work, and workers have rights that must be protected.
