

OPPORTUNITIES TO GROW IN FAITH: Did you know that as an alternative to our regular Christian Formation classes that occur on Sundays from mid September through the end of April, we offer an intergenerational program called FIRE here at Incarnation that is open to all. **Family Intergenerational Religious Education (F.I.R.E.)** is done in small groups and based out of homes. Groups decide when and in what homes they will meet to complete approximately 16 lessons during the school year. Rather than dropping kids at several different class times on Sunday, everyone attends the same meeting at a time that's convenient for the whole family.

FIRE is meant to be fun, for you, for your family, and for your group as you explore the experience of being "church" for each other and grow in closeness to the Lord. JUSTICE AND CHARITY MINISTRY

IMPACT SACRED CONVERSATIONS: As God's children, we are all invited to participate in the justice work of our faith by inviting the outcasts to our banquet. Before we get to the Annual Assembly in October, we each have a chance to share stories of the people we know who have felt cast aside. These are our Sacred Conversations, or House Meetings. Justice Ministry team members will be calling people they know to invite them to one of these conversations over the next several weeks. If you would like to attend (or if you can't make the evening you're invited to), call Sheila in the Parish Office, and she will make sure you get connected.

COMPOST BIN: You may have noticed Incarnation's new compost bin in the community garden! We are hoping to reduce our waste stream and protect God's creation by composting our food waste. FOOD MINISTRY-INVITATION: For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles. Currently, we are looking for help with potential **home deliveries** of food to parishioners who can no longer make it to Incarnation. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with both paper and plastic bags). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. **This week's item is cereal (including and oatmeal).**

GREEN TEAM EnvironMINUTE: In his encyclical on creation care, Pope Francis highlights "integral ecology" as the basis of the conversion we are all called to in order to save our common home from destruction. "Integral ecology" is the profound, fundamental interconnection between God, human beings, and all the rest of creation. With Pope Francis we pray, "Triune God... Give us the grace to feel profoundly joined to everything that is."

JUSTICE CORNER: "Do not take advantage of a hired worker who is poor and needy, whether that worker is an Israelite or is a foreigner residing in one of your towns. Pay them their wages each day before sunset, because they are poor and are counting on it. Otherwise they may cry to the Lord against you, and you will be guilty of sin" (Deuteronomy 24:14-15). On this Labor Day weekend, let's remember those who do menial labor and those who are victims of wage theft. Work to make sure that the people who serve you are being treated fairly by their employers, both on an individual basis, and under the law!

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD DAYS: Incarnation participates in the work of Habitat for Humanity, building houses for and with community members in need! No construction experience is necessary, and this is a great way to spend a Saturday living our faith and doing tangible work in the community. SIX PACK SONGWRITER SHOWCASE TO BENEFIT PACEM : On Sunday, September 10, from 7:00-11:00pm, The Southern Cafe and Music Hall on the downtown mall will host the Six Pack Songwriter Showcase to benefit PACEM. The concert will feature six local performers (Peyton Tochterman, Will Overman, Susan Munson, John Kelly, Debra Guy, Mark Roebuck) all donating their time so that PACEM will receive 65% of the evening's proceeds.
