

Over the past month, many of our parishioners have contributed their support to the 2013 Annual Diocesan Appeal. To date, we have raised **\$48,708** on a target of **\$34,580** putting us at **140%** of our target. In addition, all parishes receive back a portion of their amounts collected. This means the more we collect, the more we can address our important parish needs. This year, the funds returned to us will be used for staff support for our Justice and Charity ministries. TRAVELING MARY: Children in grade 3 Christian Formation classes here at Incarnation have started taking turns taking a basket with a statue of Mary, a rosary, a children's book about Mary and how to pray the rosary home each week. Families are asked to place the statue of Mary in a well-frequented and special place in their home to encourage them to pray *through* Mary to her son, Jesus. Just think how often you ask another to pray for you (known as intercessory prayer). Why not ask Mary to do the same? Praying *through* Mary to Jesus is especially efficacious, for what son would not listen to his mother, and what mother does not want her son known by others!

The week will include visits to a number of social service agencies working with immigrants; sharing company and meals with immigrants in the area; visiting a center for detained children; talking with Border Patrol about the work they do and the challenges faced; spending a day in a *colonia* town in rural Texas; and a number of other activities to help us explore this complex issue and consider how, as Catholics, we are called to "welcome the stranger among us," as the US Bishops say.
