Absentee Ballot Applications are used to obtain a mailed ballot when the registered voter will be absent from or unable to go to the place in which he/she is entitled to vote. They are **due October 28**. Absentee Ballots are useful for business travelers, military members, college students, disabled, and elderly voters.
