

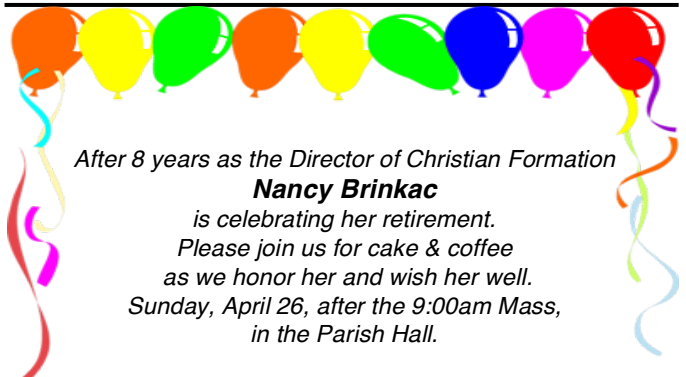

CROSSING BORDERS: We are starting a JustFaith module focusing on the teaching of the Catholic Church in regards to immigration. With the current state of the country and the world, with fear dominating much of our nation's responses, it's important to bring Jesus' example into the debate, and learn about loving and compassionate possibilities.
