



SUPPORT COMMUNITIES FOR UNACCOMPANIED MINORS: Sin Barreras, an immigrant outreach organization in Charlottesville, is



hosting a bilingual workshop by Community Attention Foster Care on Sunday, April 26 in at 3:00pm in the Parish Hall. That organization provides foster families for children in need, including unaccompanied minors, and also provides networks of support for children who may be living with family who don't have legal status. Thus, they are an in-road to creating intercultural connections and support, especially when the families have to deal with

government agencies (such as school or court). As Catholics, we are called to welcome the stranger, and all are welcome to attend and learn more about ways to get involved.

TRIP TO PHILADELPHIA: Incarnation is organizing a trip to visit and work at the St. Francis Inn, a soup kitchen in inner city Philadelphia. We will depart on June 12 and return June 14. This is a wonderful opportunity to answer God's call to feed the hungry, and to experience community and care as you get to know both guests and staff at the Inn. CALLING ALL REPORTERS: Justice and Charity ministries frequently have lots of amazing things happening, and we want to keep our parish informed about them!
