








Father Gregory will be leading a new reading group, beginning on Wednesday, October 28, at 7:30pm in the Stone Chapel. This new reading group will meet every other Wednesday after that; so, for example, the second meeting will be on

November 11. The book we will be reading is **Living Peace: A Spirituality of Contemplation and Action** by Father John Dear. For John Dear, a priest of the Diocese of Monterey and respected leader of the ecumenical peace movement, the spiritual life is a combination of contemplation and action, of maintaining inner peace and projecting that peace into the greater world. It is the spirituality exemplified by the lives of Gandhi, Martin Luther King, Jr., Mother Teresa, the Dalai Lama, and others throughout history who remained true to the highest ideals while addressing the most difficult problems and conflicts of the real world. As a tireless advocate for social justice and human rights, Dear has followed that path in his own life, and in **Living Peace** he describes his journey. Breaking down the life of peace into three parts -- an inner journey, a public journey, and the journey of all humanity -- he shares the spiritual practices that have sustained him and teaches readers how to integrate these practices into their own lives.
