



In this *Year of Mercy*, we marvel at how God's mercy breaks in to the lives of ordinary people in good times and in crisis. That is what we see in the films that we view and discuss at our parish TNT (**Theater 'N' Theology**). Our Easter season TNT takes place on *Friday, April 15*, beginning promptly at 7:00pm. All are welcome to come to our **Incarnation Movie Theater** (the "Stone Chapel") with comfortable seating and large projection. After the movie (the "Theology" part), we

discuss the film's relevance to our life in Christ and note the action of God's mercy. Our Easter feature is the 1953 film **I Confess**. A priest hears a murderer's confession and is himself accused of the crime. Made in Quebec, it is intriguing for its stark photography and symbolism. LIVING OUR MISSION CAMPAIGN – UPDATE

We are happy to announce that as of March 31, 2016 \$906,446 has been pledged to the Living Our Mission Campaign, with \$285,884 already collected. We have already received \$75,284.95 as part of the first two quarterly payments. We are pleased to inform you that we have made a payment of \$25,000 to SunTrust Bank to reduce our parish debt and \$26,609.94 has been utilized to replace all the parking lot lights to energy efficient LED lamps, as well as new LED lamps in the women's and men's bathrooms.

In addition our maintenance and housekeeping staff has been busy at work with the following:

- Repair and paint main office walls
- Painting and renovating both men's and ladies' bathrooms
- Install new customized blinds in the work room
- Install new freezer in the sacristy
- Prime and paint Confessional room
- Repair and patch leaks on over 100' of flat roof in classroom wing
- Caulk and seal small thin glass windows in the Daily Mass Chapel.
- Scrub main hall, parish hall and upper class hallway and apply two coats of wax on the floors

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES (CRS) THANK YOU: Our community changed lives this Lent, and CRS Rice Bowl wants to say THANK YOU! Don't forget to turn in your CRS Rice Bowl in the Narthex this weekend.

IMPACT (Interfaith Movement Promoting Action by Congregations Together) **UPCOMING DATES:** One of the ways Incarnation acts on our call to do justice is through IMPACT. We have many updates to share from our research. We are speaking out for women in our community who need residential treatment for substance abuse, and the elder care community is looking into both the cost and the coordination of long-term care. FOOD MINISTRY: Food ministry is a beautiful way to be concretely involved in the Work of Mercy of Feeding the Hungry. If you want to help out with the tasks of the ministry, please contact Sheila in the office. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with paper bags). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. **This week's item is 5 lb bags of dried pinto beans.**
