Bishop's Residence: "As announced in Bishop Knestout's June 11, 2018 letter, work is now underway at 800 S. Cathedral Place to restore the property as Bishop Knestout's permanent residence. Originally designed as a home for the Bishop in 1907, the building previously had been home to Cathedral parish offices. Parish offices are now located next door at 823 Cathedral Place the former home of Catholic Campus Ministry (CCM). CCM has moved to 20 N. Laurel across from the Cathedral. More details will follow once the extent of the repairs and the budget are finalized."

ON A SAFETY NOTE, we have created guidelines on how to interact with the guests and there are copies on the signup table. Remember this is a low barrier emergency shelter of last resort. We do not know the backgrounds of these men so children should be well supervised by adults and a single adult should not be left in a room alone.
