

**FINDING A MASS WHILE ON VACATION**



You can check the website for the diocese you will be visiting. You can also visit [Masstimes.org](http://Masstimes.org), where you simply type the zip code you will be visiting in the box at the top and press enter. A list of churches closest to the zip code, along with scheduled Mass times appears. One note: It's a good idea to also check the parish's website to verify the time.

**ORDINARY TIME: SUMMER**

What do the words Ordinary Time mean? Dorothy Day said, "The words 'Ordinary Time' in our prayer books put me in a state of confusion and irritation. To me, no time is ordinary." She was right. The Ordinary in "Ordinary Time" refers to ordinal – counted – time, not to a lack of something to celebrate. The Roman document, General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, says: "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character [Advent, Christmastime, Lent, Triduum, and Eastertime], 33 or 34 weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects."

How do we celebrate "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects"? We gather every Sunday. Sunday is our original feast day. Christians have gathered every Sunday – the day of Christ's resurrection, the first today of the week – ever since there were Christians.

When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always, we hear the scriptures proclaimed. The church reads straight through "the gospel of the year," either Matthew, Mark or Luke, each week often picking up where we left off last week (we read John during Lent and Easter and on feasts.) The first readings, from the first testament of the Bible, have been chosen for their relationship to the gospel passages. Many voices are heard throughout summer Ordinary Time. We also read through some of the letters of the second testament of the Bible. The mystery of Christ "in all its aspects" unfolds.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We do our eucharist; that is, we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation; we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ's life, death and resurrection. We share the bread and wine, the body and blood. We are sent forth to the body and blood of Christ in our homes, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, our towns, our cities, our neighborhoods.

"What happens in our churches every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. This is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living." (Saint Andrew Bible Missal [Brooklyn: William J. Hirten Co., 1982.]

**FOOD MINISTRY-INVITATION:** For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles. The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. This week, the item of the week is **hearty soups and other non-perishable foods**.



**OUTREACH MINISTRY UPDATE:** We are blessed in our parish to have generous donors for our many needs. Thank you to all who have donated egg cartons, we now have an abundant supply and are no longer accepting donations. **ALSO**, we don't have the facility to accept donated clothing, please bring your donations to other thrift stores (Hinton Avenue Methodist Church has a free clothing closet, and Salvation Army provides clothing vouchers).

**GREEN TEAM EnvironMINUTE:** If you want to make sure that you are being a good steward of God's gift of water during these hot summer days, you can pay attention to when you water your garden or lawn. But watering at dawn and dusk, you can ensure that the water doesn't immediately evaporate

**JUSTICE CORNER:** Doing justice requires faith in a God who can do the impossible. All our meetings as a justice ministry are based in prayer and discernment, as well as action. In 2014, despite a nation wide shortage of child psychiatrists, we stood up for the young people in our community, and got a commitment from Region Ten to staff 40 hours per week of child psychiatry, more than double what they had been doing!

**HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD DAYS:** Incarnation participates in the work of Habitat for Humanity, building houses for and with community members in need! No construction experience is necessary, and this is a great way to spend a Saturday living our faith and doing tangible work in the community.
