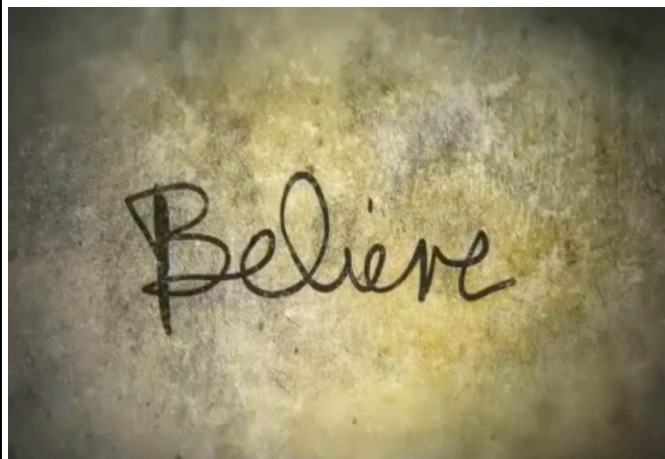

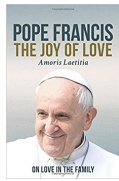

One of the most important ministries in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the support and care given by sponsors and godparents.

What does the church say about sponsors and about godparents?

"Sponsors are persons who have known and assisted the candidates and stand as witnesses to the candidates' moral character, faith, and intention." (RCIA, Intro. 10)

Sponsors have a significant role to play in the formation of the catechumens. Sponsors are like masters in an apprenticeship relationship, passing along the living tradition of the Church.

Among their responsibilities is to assist the catechumens on their faith journey, as well as, acquaint the catechumen with the community and offer initial support and care.

Join us for a 2 hour session where we study the sponsor's role in the RCIA process and identify formation opportunities.

How did your state legislators vote on issues important to Virginia Catholics? The Senate and House charts track major legislative pursuits of Bishop Francis DiLorenzo and Bishop Michael Burbidge through the Conference, their public policy agency in Richmond. Included are votes on an initiative to defund Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers, a measure to protect faith-based institutions from being punished for acting according to their beliefs, and efforts to protect immigrants and refugees. THE CRAYON INITIATIVE (<http://thecrayoninitiative.org>) is a non-profit organization that organizes crayon collections that takes **unwanted crayons**, remanufactures them, and provides them to hospitals that are caring for our kids. Hospital arts' programs provide in-hospital entertainment and learning programs. During a hospital stay, it's important for children to continue normal childhood development and skills building and to keep life as close to "normal" as possible for them. Art helps hospitalized children by alleviating anxiety, providing psychological support, and offering creative outlets for self-expression. Childrens' arts programs also enhance problem-solving and critical thinking skills, and promote creativity and imagination. Children can escape into a world of fantasy penned by their own imagination just by using crayons. The wax from crayons is not biodegradable and will never break down, leaving a waxy sludge in our landfills for centuries to come. The Crayon Initiative supports environmental efforts by diverting crayons from the landfills. Annually, over 500,000 pounds of broken crayons are discarded in landfills throughout the country. By collecting unwanted crayons from restaurants, schools, as well as other locations, and recycling them into new ones, The Crayon Initiative is doing our part to prevent crayons from depositing in the landfill." **Look for collection boxes in the Narthex and CF hallway through April 30.**
