Stewardship, A Way of Life

"All that we do reflects Christ
as we go forth in love and service."

If we, as parents, practice stewardship, we are not only fulfilling the words of the gospel and giving meaning to our lives, but we are living examples of Christ to our children. We are called by Jesus, both adults and children, to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, to practice hospitality, to clothe the naked, to care for the sick, to help people who are not free, and to be a blessing to others.

Today we are inviting all the children and youth of our parish to become stewards of our faith, and join the hundreds of families who support our parish ministries. Over the next few weeks, we will have boxes of envelopes for our children and youth to take home. Each box contains 52 weekly offertory envelope, which we ask you to return in the Sunday offertory collection. We also ask you to print your name and address on the first few envelopes so we can add you to our list of stewards.

Stewardship means "becoming partners in God's work." It means investing your time, talent and treasure to support the mission of our Church. Again we invite the children and youth of Church of the Incarnation to be a part of this effort to bring the concept of stewardship to the entire community.
