
Bible New Testament

The Bible should be the indispensable handbook for any follower of Jesus. As Saint Jerome, one of the four great Doctors of the Western Church said, "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Do we have a working familiarity with the Bible, especially the New Testament? On Sunday, June 11, between the morning Masses (starting about 10:15am), Father Gregory's Adult Sunday school topic will be **The New Testament, Part 2** in the Parish Activity Center. On May 7 we had Part 1, and we will continue our journey through the entire New Testament so we can all become more familiar with the New Testament landscape. It will be an adventure, so grab a cup of coffee and come on over! All are welcome. Like all good Catholics, BYOB: Bring your own Bible!



We marvel at how God's mercy, presence, and grace breaks in to the lives of ordinary people in good times and in crisis. That is what we see in the films that we view and discuss at our parish TNT (Theater 'N' Theology). Our next TNT takes place on **Friday, June 16**, beginning promptly at 7:00pm. JUSTICE AND CHARITY MINISTRY

FOOD MINISTRY-INVITATION: For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles. Currently, we are looking for help with potential **home deliveries** of food to parishioners who can no longer make it to Incarnation. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with paper bags and empty egg cartons). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. This week, the item of the week is **condiments**.

GREEN TEAM EnvironMINUTE Today as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, we think about the ways the Holy Spirit was revealed in the ministry of the apostles. They could now preach the good news in all languages! As we spread the good news about caring for God's creation, let us not be afraid to reach out to people who may not understand. Last week, Pope Francis gave our president a copy of *Laudato Si'* at their meeting. Perhaps we can encourage a Catholic friend to read this encyclical, or an environmentally conscious non-Catholic to check it out.

JUSTICE CORNER: As Catholics, we are called to live out the Corporal Works of Mercy. We see people in our own community being poorly treated because they are strangers and outsiders. That's why, working with our Justice Ministry, we pushed the Regional Jail and the local Police to develop plans for those with limited English proficiency, making sure that all would be treated fairly within the system.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY BUILD DAYS: Incarnation participates in the work of Habitat for Humanity, building houses for and with community members in need! No construction experience is necessary, and this is a great way to spend a Saturday living our faith and doing tangible work in the community. We also need people to photograph the event, and provide lunch. Our next build date is July 15. Please check out the sign-up sheets in the Narthex !

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING (CST) 101: One of the most often referred to tenants of CST is the Preferential Option for the Poor and Vulnerable. This means that God loves all of us, but when God came to in the form of Jesus, he chose to spend time with the outcasts of society. If we want to follow the footsteps of Jesus, we are called to serve first the needs of our poor and vulnerable brothers and sisters. At Incarnation, we have many opportunities to live this preferential option. We provide toiletries to Offender Aid and Restoration, which helps the often marginalized individuals just getting out of prison. We also teach English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), addressing the vulnerability of people in our society who can't speak the language. There are many other ways to reach out to the poor and vulnerable, and if you are feeling called to participate in them, please contact Sheila.
