








Openings are still available for the 2014 Litnic season! Litnics are a venerable Incarnation summer tradition; they are *Liturgic picnics*, and here's how they work.

Someone who wants to host a litnic calls the parish office and signs up for one of the posted available dates. They receive parish guidelines for hosting a litnic which must be read carefully. Litnics are particularly intended for Catholics in the host's neighborhood, but all parishioners are invited to litnics. A Mass is celebrated in the home or the yard (the *lit*) followed by a potluck supper (the *nic*). Available dates for summer 2014 follow:

Our church is linked with this community, and this past March five parishioners visited. EL PASO VISIT! The past two years, groups from Incarnation have visited the School Sisters of St. Francis in El Paso, TX, and both trips were an incredible experience. This summer, Sr. Fran is coming to Incarnation to tell the rest of the parish about the sisters' ministry at the US/ Mexico border. She will be selling products from the Centro Santa Catalina co-op in Ciudad Juarez, Mexico on the weekend of July 5/6. However, she is also willing to speak to groups about anything from Immigration Reform to life in El Paso during the week she will be in town.

LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY: Advocacy, or speaking for others, is an important part of our civic engagement as Catholics. The person who has been leading Incarnation's legislative advocacy ministry is stepping down, and we're looking for someone interested in taking on this work. This will involve helping with voter registration drives and absentee ballots, as well as keeping up with the Virginia Catholic Conference about legislation in Virginia that has a moral component. I don't know enough about my faith to teach? *The most important quality of a catechist is not knowledge of the faith, but an unabashed belief that faith is central to the way they live their life and a desire to help others encounter Christ. On a practical level, Teacher's Manuals tell you everything you need to know. If you are the least bit inclined to give this a try, contact Nancy at the office to discuss the possibility.*
