Our next **TNT (Theater 'N' Theology)** takes place on *Friday, October 24*, beginning promptly at 7:00pm. All are welcome to come watch a movie in our **Incarnation Movie Theater** (the "Stone Chapel") with comfortable seating and large projection. Afterwards (the "Theology" part), we discuss the movie's relevance to our life in Christ. Our October feature is the 1950 Italian film The Flowers of St. Francis, in honor of St. Francis' feast day on October 4. The film dramatizes about a dozen vignettes from the life of St. Francis and his early followers - starting with their return in the rain to Rivotorto from Rome when the Pope blessed their Rule and ending with their dispersal to preach. The unconnected chapters are like parables, some with a moral. The slight and comic Juniper returns naked to St. Mary of the Angels, having given away his tunic, but not his ricotta. The aged Giovanni shouts and holds onto his cape; the beatific St. Clare pays a visit. Humble Francis doubts his leadership, hugs a leper, and sends his brothers spinning, dizzy, and smiling into the world. This brotherhood is infused with whimsy as well as belief. Directed by Roberto Rossellini, and written by Rossellini and Federico Fellini. Childcare can be available for a modest fee if reserved at the Parish Office by October 20. Facilitated by Fr. Gregory. **ATTENTION PARENTS** of children in Christian Formation **Grade 2** at incarnation, in F.I.R.E. or attending CCS:

Your child will be preparing for two sacraments this year: **First Reconciliation** and **First Eucharist**. You will play an important role in that preparation and should have received a letter by mail telling you what is expected of you. *Please let Nancy know if you did not receive this letter.*

Our first Parent Meeting is on October 15, at 7:00pm in the Parish Activities Center (stone building across the parking lot from the office entrance). *This is for parents only.* Please let Nancy know if you need to use the Nursery for your children. If your child was not baptized at Incarnation, kindly bring a copy of your child's baptismal certificate. Also, a \$30 fee to cover the cost of books and other expenses will be collected at this meeting.



**TRAVELING MARY:** Grade 3 families are in for a special blessing as children take turns taking a basket with a statue of Mary and prayers, such as the rosary for children, home each week. Families are asked to place the statue of Mary in a special place in their home to encourage them to pray *through* Mary to her son, Jesus. Just think how often you ask another to pray for you (known as intercessory prayer). Why not ask Mary to do the same? Praying *through* Mary is especially efficacious, for what son would not listen to his mother, and what mother does not want her son known by others! During this month of October, which is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, why not join our 3rd graders and let the grace of Jesus Christ flow through Mary to you and your family.

**ROSARY COLLECTION:** We will collect rosaries through the month of October to be sent to Fr. Michael Mugomba's (Shepherd of the Hills Church, Ruckersville) hometown school, St. Theresa's in Mituana, Uganda. **IMPACT (Interfaith Movement Promoting Action By Congregations Together) ANNUAL ASSEMBLY:** Thank you to everyone who has participated in our listening sessions about community issues over the past months! We are now at the point in our process where we need to vote on one issue to focus our time this coming year. Monday, October 27 from 6:30-8:00pm will be our Annual Assembly at St Thomas Aquinas Church. We want as many people there from Incarnation as possible, to make our voice heard in this important public arena. Please plan to come!



**ELECTION 2014:** Our bishop has observed that "participating in the political process, and thereby helping to create a more just society, is an essential part of what it means to be a follower of Christ in our Commonwealth today," and voting on Election Day should be a priority for every parishioner. To facilitate voting on November 4, Absentee Ballot Applications are available at the Social Justice Bulletin Board inside the Narthex. Registration Applications are used to establish eligibility or report a change in name or address and are **due October 15**. Absentee Ballot Applications are used to obtain a mailed ballot when the registered voter will be absent from or unable to go to the place in which he/she is entitled to vote. They are **due October 28**. Absentee Ballots are useful for business travelers, military members, college students, disabled, and elderly voters.

**PACEM (People and Congregations Engaged in Ministry):** We will host our PACEM homeless guests from Nov.15-28. We want to turn the PAC into a comfortable, safe and caring place for our guests. PACEM is a great opportunity to serve in so many different ways. We need daily lead volunteers, cooks, meal servers, overnight volunteers, setup and take down folks, sandwich makers, hard boiled egg cookers, orange juice, milk, and fresh fruit providers, haircutters, and laundry volunteers. We need volunteers for evening activities and spending time with our guests. There are lots of ways to pitch in and help. In the past we have taught some how to play the harmonica, given haircuts, given foot care, doctor consultations etc. If you have any special skills which you would like to share with these men contact Tom Eckman at 295-3015 or Sheila. **Please sign-up early!
