


We welcome all visitors and invite you to join us in the Parish Hall for coffee & donuts after the 9:00am Sunday Mass.

MASS OF REMEMBRANCE



On Wed., Nov. 5, at 7:30pm, we will have our Annual Mass of Remembrance. This is the occasion when we take time to remember and celebrate the lives of those relatives and friends who have died during the past year. If you have lost a family member or close friend since last November, we invite you to call the Parish Office 973-4381 with the name to be included in our Book of Remembrance. All parishioners are invited to attend this liturgy in support of those who have lost loved ones. Reception to follow, please bring a finger food to share.

Our next **TNT (Theater 'N' Theology)** takes place on *Friday, October 24*, beginning promptly at 7:00pm. All are welcome to come watch a movie in our **Incarnation Movie Theater** (the "Stone Chapel") with comfortable seating and large projection. Afterwards (the "Theology" part), we discuss the movie's relevance to our life in Christ. Our October feature is the 1950 Italian film The Flowers of St. Francis, in honor of St. Francis' feast day on October 4. The film dramatizes about a dozen vignettes from the life of St. Francis and his early followers - starting with their return in the rain to Rivotorto from Rome when the Pope blessed their Rule and ending with their dispersal to preach. The unconnected chapters are like parables, some with a moral. The slight and comic Juniper returns naked to St. Mary of the Angels, having given away his tunic, but not his ricotta. The aged Giovanni shouts and holds onto his cape; the beatific St. Clare pays a visit. Humble Francis doubts his leadership, hugs a leper, and sends his brothers spinning, dizzy, and smiling into the world. This brotherhood is infused with whimsy as well as belief. Directed by Roberto Rossellini, and written by Rossellini and Federico Fellini. Childcare can be available for a modest fee if reserved at the Parish Office by October 20. Facilitated by Fr. Gregory. Statement by Bishop Paul S. Loverde and Bishop Francis X. DiLorenzo

On Supreme Court Refusal to Hear Appeal of Virginia Same-Sex Marriage Ruling



With deep disappointment, we learned today that the U.S. Supreme Court has denied review of lower-court decisions that struck down Virginia's law prohibiting same-sex marriage and similar laws in four other states. Because of the Supreme Court's denial, marriages between couples of the same sex have begun today in Virginia. This occurrence reflects a fundamental misunderstanding of the intrinsic nature of marriage and represents an injustice to over a million Virginia voters, whose decision was to enshrine the understanding of marriage as the union of one man and one woman into our state's constitution.

Marriage has been affirmed by countless generations because it uniquely benefits the common good by recognizing the union of two equal but complementary individuals – that is, a man and a woman – who, by their life-giving union, may create a family. Marriage not only benefits the man and woman who enter it, but also best serves children because of the particular contributions that mothers and fathers bring to family life. Therefore, Virginia's constitution rightly recognized the unique contributions marriage makes to children and to the common good.

As Bishops we will continue to affirm the truth about marriage, the lifelong union of one man and one woman, as well as its essential importance to the common good. As pastors, teachers, and faith leaders, we can do nothing less. It is our fervent hope that the Supreme Court will reconsider this fundamental issue in the future.

ELECTION 2014: Our bishop has observed that "participating in the political process, and thereby helping to create a more just society, is an essential part of what it means to be a follower of Christ in our Commonwealth today," and voting on Election Day should be a priority for every parishioner. To facilitate voting on November 4, Absentee Ballot Applications are available at the Social Justice Bulletin Board inside the Narthex. Absentee Ballot Applications are used to obtain a mailed ballot when the registered voter will be absent from or unable to go to the place in which he/she is entitled to vote. They are **due October 28**. Absentee Ballots are useful for business travelers, military members, college students, disabled, and elderly voters.

FOOD MINISTRY: Many people from our parish community give of their time and donate food to this ministry, and we invite you to join their inspiring example.
