In October, the 14th Ordinary Synod of Bishops will convene to discuss the topic of "The Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and Contemporary World." In preparation for this, the Synod Fathers have asked the People of God to respond to a series of questions that will help inform their discussions and conclusions. Visit bit.ly/CDRSynod2015 to complete an **online questionnaire** comprising 22 short answer questions condensed from the original *Lineamenta*. The questionnaire **must be completed by 8:30am on Monday, March 2**. Responses may be anonymous and will be included in the final report that the Diocese of Richmond will send to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to be then compiled with other diocesan reports and sent to Rome. Consider stopping by for the screening. *All records are confidential and each blood pressure is taken with the American Heart Association approved method.*

The Health Wagon provides health care to the poor in Southwest Virginia: The Health Wagon is a nonprofit organization providing mobile health services to the medically underserved in Southwest Virginia. Supported by the Diocese of Richmond, the Health Wagon visits eight sites and provides a medical home to over 2,500 patients, many of whom have no other health care options. More than 70% of Health Wagon patients have no insurance. The Health Wagon's client services are rendered free of charge. The work done by the Health Wagon was featured in a segment on CBS' 60 Minutes in August of 2014, documenting the vital needs served by the Health Wagon, including preventive screening, diabetes and blood pressure management.

The Health Wagon's staff consists of two full time certified family nurse practitioners, one registered nurse, two licensed practical nurses, a Director of Operations, a Director of Development, Data Systems Coordinator, and an Administrative Assistant.

Every dollar donated to the Health Wagon is approximately \$100 reaped in health care benefits. Please be generous.

SUPPORT COMMUNITIES FOR UNACCOMPANIED MINORS: Sin Barreras, an immigrant outreach organization here in Charlottesville, is hosting a bilingual workshop at 3:00pm on TODAY (2/22) by *Community Attention Foster Care*. That organization provides foster families for children in need, including unaccompanied minors, and also provides networks of support for children who may be living with family who don't have legal status. Thus, they are an in-road to creating intercultural connections and support, especially when the families have to deal with government agencies (such as school or court). As Catholics, we are called to welcome the stranger, and all are welcome to attend and learn more about ways to get involved.
