



FOOD MINISTRY: Food ministry is one of the most concrete ways to fill the basic needs of families who don't have enough. You can help out by doing some of the tasks required to run this ministry. We accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, and encourage you to be creative and give food that you enjoy eating. If you need inspiration, the item of the week is an easy thing to add to your shopping list. You can bring this item, or anything else you want to donate, to church Sunday. This week, our item is **10 lb bags of dried pinto beans.**

IMPACT: One of the ways Incarnation acts on our call to do justice is through IMPACT. This year, as we try to effect positive change around drugs and crime, we are researching three areas of intervention: in the community, in sentencing, and in jails.
