

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR:

As everyone will recall, over the course of the past two months we have made several announcements at Mass and in the Bulletin and asked for your input about which parish needs we should prioritize in our upcoming Living Our Mission capital campaign. Through the suggestions we received from you online, through the gathering we held with Diocesan representatives, and through the discussions with the Pastoral and Finance Councils, we have decided our case will have three primary elements: a Present and Future Campus Maintenance Fund, an Evangelization Fund, and a Debt Reduction fund. This effort will enable us to provide improved outdoor lighting, replace and renovate our bathrooms, improve our heating and cooling systems, and carry out evangelization initiatives such as the possibility of another tent revival or hosting a nationally-known speaker. I'm confident that this effort will strengthen our parish and our Diocese to advance the Church's mission of worship and service for generations to come. FOOD MINISTRY: In this season of new life, it's great to pay the joy forward by donating to Incarnation's food ministry. We accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, and encourage you to be creative and give food that you enjoy eating. If you need inspiration, the item of the week is an easy thing to add to your shopping list. You can bring this item, or anything else you want to donate, to church Sunday. This week, our item is a **10 lb. bag of pinto beans**.



HABITAT FOR HUMANITY: All are invited to come out on August 1 to participate in our next build day! No construction experience is necessary, all training is provided on site. We also need people to photograph the event, and provide lunch. If you can't make the August build, you can check your calendar now for October 3 and November 7, which will be our other fall build days. JUSTFAITH INTEREST: The Office of Justice and Charity is considering offering a JustFaith course next year. This is an eight month (32 week) commitment, with weekly meetings, reading, and service assignments. This is an in-depth look at Catholic Social Teaching and how we can live it out in our daily lives. The goal is to integrate personal spirituality and social ministry, allowing participants to develop a passion for Justice.
