




Opportunities to GROW in Faith

Did you know that as an alternative to our regular Christian Formation classes that occur on Sundays from mid September through the end of April, we offer an intergenerational program called FIRE here at Incarnation that is open to all. **Family Intergenerational Religious Education (F.I.R.E.)** is done in small groups and based out of homes. Groups decide when and in what homes they will meet to complete approximately 16 lessons during the school year. Rather than dropping kids at several different class times on Sunday, everyone attends the same meeting at a time that's convenient for the whole family.

FIRE is meant to be fun, for you, for your family, and for your group as you explore the experience of being "church" for each other and grow in closeness to the Lord. DISCUSSION GROUP


