#### MIGRANT MINISTRY TRAINING





**PARISH SUMMER READING!**





**SCHOOL SUPPLY DRIVE:** Incarnation has adopted Agnor-Hurt Elementary School to help provide school supplies for this year. **FOOD MINISTRY:** One of the couples who has helped with scheduling for Food ministry is moving away, and we are looking for someone to take their place in a coordinating role. **GREEN TEAM'S EnvironMINUTE:** One technique to decrease your carbon footprint is to decrease packaging. This can mean getting produce without wrappers or buying in bulk. Both of these steps allow you to be closer to God's creation, and throw fewer things away.
