



### Centering Prayer

**PRESENTATION ON CENTERING PRAYER**

We hear and read about modern practices of meditation. While these are widely taught, few people know that there is an ancient Christian practice known as Centering Prayer. Come to the Parish Activity Center after the the 9:00am on Sun., July 31 where Herb Ely will present a brief introduction to this prayer as taught by Trappist Monk Thomas Keating.

Centering Prayer is a receptive method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer. In this *Year of Mercy*, we marvel at how God's mercy breaks in to the lives of ordinary people in good times and in crisis. It is a poignant and pointed look at family ties, old wounds, love, and responsibility, with uniformly fine performances. Hume Cronyn adds immeasurable strength, though he says not a word. Rachel Portman's beautiful score is another asset. Also starring Meryl Streep, Leonardo DiCaprio, Diane Keaton, Robert De Niro, and Gwen Verdon. Rated PG-13. Facilitated by Fr. Gregory. 
