


THE RCIA is the process of formation and instruction for **those adults who wish to be baptized and those baptized Christians who wish to enter the Roman Catholic Church.** It is a **DISCERNMENT JOURNEY**, a process of learning and growing towards making a decision to follow Christ in the Catholic Church. This process begins on *September 15* 7:30pm in the Conference Room.

All revealed truths derive from the same divine source and are to be believed with the same faith, yet some of them are more important for giving direct expression to the heart of the Gospel. In this basic core, what shines forth is the beauty of the saving love of God made manifest in Jesus Christ who died and rose from the dead. In this sense, the Second Vatican Council explained, "in Catholic doctrine there exists an order or a 'hierarchy' of truths, since they vary in their relation to the foundation of the Christian faith." This holds true as much for the dogmas of faith as for the whole corpus of the Church's teaching, including her moral teaching.

Our Holy Father Pope Francis published an Apostolic Exhortation titled **Amoris Laetitia** (The Joy of Love) on March 19 as his authoritative teaching following the World Synod of Bishops on the Family last year. Our parish will have a discussion group on this important instruction by Pope Francis beginning on the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross, **September 14**, and meeting normally every other Wednesday after that through the year, 7:30-9:00pm in the Parish Activities Center. The text that will be used will be the edition published by The Word Among Us Press, which can be obtained at The Sycamore Tree. Since the Annual Diocesan Appeal was revamped in 2010, it has provided significant funding for the local priorities of parishes and the larger ministries of the Diocese. In addition, this allows more time to expand our efforts as it relates to campaign continuation, legacy giving and parish stewardship as well as the new Catholic Community Foundation. We appreciate your accommodation to this change.

More information will be forthcoming later in year and I am hopeful you will join us in once again supporting the immediate needs addressed through the Annual Diocesan Appeal.
