

Preaching should guide the assembly, and the preacher, to a life-changing communion with Christ in the Eucharist.



It's time to plan for the **2018 Litnic season!** Litnics are a venerable Incarnation summer tradition; they are *Liturgy picnics*, and here's how they work. Someone who wants to host a litnic calls the Parish Office and signs up for one of the posted available dates. They receive parish guidelines for hosting a litnic which must be read carefully. Litnics are particularly intended for Catholics in the host's neighborhood, but all parishioners are invited to litnics. 
