


**CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING GROUP:** We had a great reading group meeting last Monday. Feel free to join us at our next get together on October 29, as we get further into Gaudium et Spes. Most of us have a basic understanding of Catholic Teaching and what it means for our everyday life, but it is always good to explore in greater depth!

**IMPACT ANNUAL ASSEMBLY:** Micah 6:8 states that as believers, we are to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with our God. Incarnation's Justice Ministry Team recently held some powerful conversations around the issues that worry us, including elder care, mental health, and youth so many more. Our next step is to attend IMPACT's Annual Assembly on October 30, 6:30 to 8:00pm at First Presbyterian Church downtown. Come get updates on our current initiatives around affordable housing, and be a part of getting further commitments!

**HAITI COFFEE SALE:** Our Haiti ministry will be selling fair trade coffee after all the Masses the weekend of November 3 and 4! Come support Haitian farmers as well as our own local ministry with the Little Brothers and Little Sisters of the Incarnation! Coffee is \$12 per bag.



**FOOD MINISTRY:** For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles, especially helping with distribution of food on Sunday afternoons. If you are interested in this or any aspect of the ministry, contact Sheila in the office. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with grocery bags, paper and plastic). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. This week, our item of the week is **quart and gallon size ziplock bags.**

**MIGRANT MINISTRY:** Our season for visiting the migrant camps in Albemarle County is almost over. We will be going on the second and fourth Wednesday of every month, and our next visit is October 24. **SEEKING ESOL TEACHERS:** If you are interested in helping our Spanish-speaking parishioners learn English, contact Sheila in the Parish Office! No experience is required, just a willingness to give it a try. Classes are currently scheduled for Sunday afternoons and Wednesday evenings.

**SHARE THE JOURNEY:** There are more than 11 million undocumented immigrants presently in the United States. Each year, more people enter the country, though recently there has been a net decrease. Even so, there are only 55,000 green cards available annually in the lottery, known as the Diversity Visa program. With few exceptions, these immigrants are hardworking, honest, faithful people simply desiring the opportunity to make a better life for themselves and their families. The United States is a nation of immigrants; a review of the history of our own families and of our nation reminds us of the need to welcome the stranger in our midst.

**JUSTICE CORNER:** The newly canonized St. Oscar Romero preached about the necessity for justice. "It is a caricature of love to try to cover over with alms what is lacking in justice, to patch over with an appearance of benevolence when social justice is missing. True love begins by demanding what is just in the relations of those who love.

**Green Team's EnvironMINUTE:** There are many practical ways to cut down on your water usage, protecting God's creation and your water bill. For example, turn on the faucet at a fraction of full volume for simple tasks like washing hands.
