CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING GROUP: We had a great reading group meeting last Monday. Feel free to join us at our next get together on October 29, as we get further into Gaudium et Spes. Most of us have a basic understanding of Catholic Teaching and what it means for our everyday life, but it is always good to explore in greater depth!



COFFEE AND CONVERSATIONS: Our next Café y Conversaciones will be at 3:00pm on November 18, the World Day of the Poor. This is a great opportunity to come together between the Masses to get to know other members of the parish who speak a different language. Interpreters will be at every table, and some light refreshments will be provided. If you are interested in contributing to the planning of this event (either by bringing food or by interpreting), please contact Sheila.

FOOD MINISTRY: For our food ministry to function, we need people in a variety of roles, especially helping with distribution of food on Sunday afternoons. If you are interested in this or any aspect of the ministry, contact Sheila in the office. If you'd rather donate material goods, we accept all food items in the basket in the Narthex, (along with grocery bags, paper and plastic). The item of the week is an easy way to add something small to your grocery list, and donate something that is very needed by our ministry. This week, our item of the week is **10 lb. bags of dried pinto beans.**



MIGRANT MINISTRY: Our season for visiting the migrant camps in Albemarle County is almost over. We will be going on the second and fourth Wednesday of every month, and our next visit is October 24. If you are interested in learning more or joining us, reach out to Sheila in the Parish Office.

SHARE THE JOURNEY: Our Catholic teaching affirms the right of governments to defend their borders and to regulate migration. In the United States, however, a combination of deficiencies in our existing immigration laws and inconsistent enforcement of those laws has produced an untenable situation. There are millions of undocumented workers who have lived and worked here for years, begun families, and made the U.S. their home, but have no viable pathway to citizenship. Green Team's EnvironMINUTE: Being a good steward of God's creation means using what we have well! Washing clothes in cold (or warm) water can save up to 85% of the energy used by washing clothes in hot water. It will help your energy bill and also make the clothes last longer.
