

### CLASS SCHEDULE CHANGE

There will be **NO** Christian Formation classes for Little Christians through 5<sup>th</sup> grade in English and in Spanish - on Nov. 4 (today) due to the long weekend for area public schools.

**UPDATE ON THE CHURCH ABUSE CRISIS**

On September 23, between the 9:00 and 11:30 am Masses, parishioners Mike and Nancy Brinkac convened a forum to listen to our parish responses to the church abuse crisis. Parishioner Jose Cuenca conducted a forum following the 1:30pm Mass. Fr. Gregory has also met with and heard from parishioners to discuss their concerns about the church abuse crisis.

Comments from this September 23 forum were brought to Bishop Knestout on October 18, when members of the parish and our clergy attended a regional listening session convened by the Bishop. Listening session attendees from Church of the Incarnation were: Gary Albert, Nancy Brinkac, Caroline Cook, Gloria D'Alessandro, Patrick Drury, Fr. Jaime Guardado Delgado, Carole Hatcher, Deacon Tom Healy, Sheila Herlihy, Fr. Gregory Kandt, Deacon Chris Morash, and Ed Robinson.

At the listening session, parish groups were asked to respond to questions about how they and their parish community were feeling in light of the abuse crisis. In addition, parish representatives had the opportunity to advise the Bishop on how best to lead the Diocese in the current environment. The Bishop listened to all the parish responses, and responded at the close of the evening with a commitment to effecting change in the church, and to increasing communication with parishioners in the Diocese of Richmond.

On October 24, the Attorney General of Virginia, Mark Herring, announced his office's investigation into allegations of child sexual abuse by clergy in Virginia. Anyone aware of misconduct or abuse on the part of clergy or staff of the diocese must notify legal authorities and utilize the hotline established by the Attorney General: <http://www.virginiaclergyhotline.com/>. Bishop Knestout and Bishop Burbidge (Diocese of Arlington) have released a joint statement about the investigation, which is linked to on our parish website ([incarnationparish.org](http://incarnationparish.org)).

Our parish is committed to keeping our children safe. All individuals working with children and youth, including clergy, must be compliant with diocesan requirements for child protection, completing a background check and attending a Virtus presentation ([virtus.org](http://virtus.org)). The Diocese of Richmond website contains informative and useful resources related to the abuse crisis under the headings "Help for Victims of Abuse" and "Child Protection/Safe Environment." In addition, resources and links to information related to the abuse crisis are available on our parish website.

During this unsettled time, we pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us in wisdom to build up the body of Christ at the Church of the Incarnation.
